Adler, David A. Money Madness

A fun, brightly illustrated book that introduces young readers to the

purpose and value of money.

Cheney, Lynne. When Washington Crossed the Delaware

Tells the story of how General George Washington led his exhausted, defeated troops across the Delaware on Christmas night 1776 to attack the Hessians and the British at Trenton and Princeton, turning the tide of the Revolution in favor of the Americans. Great for learning local history.

Jenkins, Steve. Never Smile at a Monkey

There are some things that you just don't do to wild animals, but did you know that it's dangerous to pet a platypus, or to touch a tang fish? This fascinating book will tell you all you need to know to protect yourself from some surprisingly dangerous creatures.
